

ON-CAMPUS HOUSING

Many international students live on campus for their first year. There are many options of residence halls and apartments. All rooms include wireless internet, cable TV, all utilities, access to study lounges and a variety of recreational areas, including billiards rooms, sand volleyball courts, basketball courts, and barbecue areas. Submit the housing form to receive a room and roommate assignment. After the first year, you can chose from a selection of luxurious and affordable nearby offcampus housing.

OFF-CAMPUS HOUSING

In some cases we will place students in off-campus accommodation. There are a lot of nearby apartment complexes, many of them are new and have great amenities too. Shops, restaurants, parks, and cinemas are all close by. The ISC will help you arrange your accommodation if all on-campus housing has been allocated.

Rent is approximately \$495 per month, per person.

You can also choose from one of the many other accommodation options available in Harrisonburg. Most offcampus housing options offer individual leases and can be arranged online before you arrive.



PROGRAMS

INTERNATIONAL YEAR

International Year includes specialized courses in American culture, English for Academic Purposes, and study skills to help you adjust to U.S. teaching methods and resources. You'll also take courses from year one of your chosen degree programs, allowing you to earn 24 to 30 credit hours.

AT-A-GLANCE

- · Available as a 1-, 2-, 3-, or 4-semester program
- · Includes academic and English courses
- Specialized academic courses that fully prepare you to enter your degree program
- · 24 to 30 credit hours for your degree


